Regulations

a) Competition

Category A – Classical Choral Music J

Category A1

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions
- The program shall consist of compositions of different characters and styles
- The compositions/arrangements can be sung in one or two parts
- One compositions shall be sung a cappella, the others may be also a cappella or accompanied by piano
- The minimal number of singers is 8

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- Category A2
- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions
- The program shall consist of compositions of different characters and styles
- The compositions/arrangements must be sung in at least three parts
- The compositions shall be sung a cappella, one may be performed accompanied by piano
- The compositions shall be performed in the original language
- The minimal number of singers is 8

Category B – Sacred Choral Music 🦨

Category B1

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions/arrangements
- The program shall consist of sacred compositions based on an idiom of serious music with different characters and styles
- The compositions/arrangements can be sung in one or two parts
- The compositions can be sung a cappella or accompanied by piano
- The minimal number of singers is 8

Category B2

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions/arrangements
- The program shall consist of sacred compositions based on an idiom of serious music with different characters and styles
- The compositions/arrangements must be sung in at least three parts
- One composition/arrangement shall be sung a cappella, the others can be performed accompanied by piano
- The minimal number of singers is 8

Category C – Folkloristic Choral Music 🎝

Category C1

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions/arrangements
- The program shall consist of compositions/arrangements based on musical idioms from any traditional folkloristic music
- The compositions/arrangements can be sung in one or two parts
- The composition/arrangement can be sung a cappella or accompanied by original unamplified acoustic instruments
- The compositions/arrangements shall be performed in the original language
- The minimal number of singers is 4

Category C2

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions/arrangements
- The program shall consist of compositions/arrangements based on musical idioms from any traditional folkloristic music
- The compositions/arrangements must be sung in at least three parts
- The composition/arrangement can be sung a cappella or accompanied by original unamplified acoustic instruments
- The compositions/arrangements shall be performed in the original language
- The minimal number of singers is 4

Category D – Popular Choral Music 🦨

Category D1

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions/arrangements
- The program can consist of secular or sacred compositions based on an idiom of popular music with different characters and styles
- The compositions/arrangements must be sung in one or two parts
- Two compositions/arrangements can be sung a cappella or accompanied by unamplified acoustic instruments
- The minimal number of singers is 8

Category D2

- Program length from 8 to 10 minutes
- 3 4 compositions/arrangements
- The program can consist of secular or sacred compositions/arrangements based on an idiom of popular music with different characters and styles
- The compositions/arrangements must be sung in at least three parts
- Two compositions/arrangements can be sung a cappella or accompanied by unamplified acoustic instruments
- The minimal number of singers is 8

Every choir may compete in two categories.

Singers must be at least 7 and at most 15 years of age to compete.

Rating

The juries consist of three members each. The rating elements are:

- Interpretation
- singing skill

- program difficulty
- general artistic impression (intonation, style, fidelity to the score)

Awards

A choir's performance may be awarded no more than 30 points. The average number of points is calculated on the basis of the total number of points awarded by the jury. The Awards with the relevant levels are presented according to the number of points received. Each award has ten levels (1-10). The awards are not limited in number.

Bronze Prize I – **X** (1,00 - 10,99 points)

• **Gold Prize** I - X (21,00 - 30,00 points)

• **Silver Prize** I - X (11,00 - 20,99 points)

b) Final Championship - Grand Prize (Grand Prix)

Choirs with the most points in their categories and which have won Gold Prizes compete for the Grand Prix performing one piece of the same repertoire. The Jury may choose additional choirs, Gold Prize winners, to enter the competition to win the Grand Prix. A jury in the expanded composition will not award points, but take a vote and choose the winner.

Special Awards

 ${\it Conductor\ Award}$ — According to its judgment, the jury may present awards to conductors and musical directors in the case of special artistic impressions.

Registration fee

Participation in one category costs 150 Euros and participation in two categories costs 200 Euros.

Registration

To register for the competition, you should mail the following:

- a completed registration form
- a photograph of the choir and conductor
- brief CVs for the choir and the conductor
- four copies of the scores for the registered compositions/arrangements
- proof of paid registration fee for participation in the Competition

The Organizer's Artistic Committee reviews and approves the registered programs. Other details may be found on the application form


The registration deadline is February 25 th, 2017.
